BUDGET INTRODUCTION

Background Information

The Belmond Reserve Community Development District is a local special purpose government authorized by Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, as amended. The Community Development District (CDD) is an alternative method for planning, financing, acquiring, operating and maintaining community-wide infrastructure in master planned communities. The CDD also is a mechanism that provides a "solution" to the State's needs for delivery of capital infrastructure to service projected growth without overburdening other governments and their taxpayers. CDDs represent a major advancement in Florida's effort to manage its growth effectively and efficiently. This allows the community to set a higher standard for construction along with providing a long-term solution to the operation and maintenance of community facilities.

The following report represents the District budget for Fiscal Year 2021, which begins on October 1, 2020. The District budget is organized by fund to segregate financial resources and ensure that the segregated resources are used for their intended purpose, and the District has established the following funds.

Facilities of the District

The District's existing facilities include storm-water management (lake and water control structures), wetland preserve areas, street lighting, landscaping, entry signage, entry features, irrigation distribution facilities, recreational center, parks, pool facility, tennis courts and other related public improvements.

Maintenance of the Facilities

In order to maintain the facilities, the District conducts hearings to adopt an operating budget each year. This budget includes a detailed description of the maintenance program along with an estimate of the cost of the program. The funding of the maintenance budget is levied as a non-ad valorem assessment on your property by the District Board of Supervisors.

GENERAL FUND 001

Financial & Administrative

District Manager

The District retains the services of a consulting manager, who is responsible for the daily administration of the District's business, including any and all financial work related to the Bond Funds and Operating Funds of the District, and preparation of the minutes of the Board of Supervisors. In addition, the District Manager prepares the Annual Budget(s), implements all policies of the Board of Supervisors, and attends all meetings of the Board of Supervisors.

District Engineer

Consists of attendance at scheduled meetings of the Board of Supervisors, offering advice and consultation on all matters related to the works of the District, such as bids for yearly contracts, operating policy, compliance with regulatory permits, etc.

Disclosure Reporting

On a quarterly and annual basis, disclosure of relevant district information is provided to the Muni Council, as required within the bond indentures.

Trustees Fees

This item relates to the fee assessed for the annual administration of bonds outstanding, as required within the bond indentures.

Auditing Services

The District is required to annually undertake an independent examination of its books, records and accounting procedures. This audit is conducted pursuant to State Law and the Rules of the Auditor General.

Postage, Phone, Fax, Copies

This item refers to the cost of materials and service to produce agendas and conduct day-to-day business of the District.

Public Officials Insurance

The District carries Public Officials Liability in the amount of \$1,000,000.

Legal Advertising

This is required to conduct the official business of the District in accordance with the Sunshine Law and other advertisement requirements as indicated by the Florida Statutes.

Bank Fees

The District operates a checking account for expenditures and receipts.

Dues, Licenses & Fees

The District is required to file with the County and State each year.

Miscellaneous Fees

To provide for unbudgeted administrative expenses.

Office Supplies

Cost of daily supplies required by the District to facilitate operations.

Website Administration

This is for maintenance and administration of the Districts official website.

Legal Counsel

District Counsel

Requirements for legal services are estimated at an annual expenditures on an as needed and also cover such items as attendance at scheduled meetings of the Board of Supervisor's, Contract preparation and review, etc.

Electric Utility Services

Electric Utility Services

This item is for street lights, pool, recreation facility and other common element electricity

Other Physical Environment

Waterway Management System
This item is for maintaining the multiple waterways that compose the district's waterway management system and aids in controlling nuisance vegetation that may otherwise restrict the flow of water

Property & Casualty Insurance

The District carries \$1,000,000 in general liability and also has sovereign immunity.

Entry & Walls Maintenance

This item is for maintaining the main entry feature and other common area walls.

Landscape Maintenance

The District contracts with a professional landscape firm to provide service through a public bid process. This fee does not include replacement material or irrigation repairs.

Miscellaneous Landscape

This item is for any unforeseen circumstances that may effect the appearance of the landscape program.

Plant Replacement Program

This item is for landscape items that may need to be replaced during the year.

RESOLUTION 2020-34

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE BELMOND RESERVE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT RESCINDING RESOLUTION 2020-19 AND ANY OTHER PRIOR INVESTMENT POLICIES AND ELECTING TO USE THE STATUTORY DEFAULT INVESTMENT POLICIES FOR INVESTING PUBLIC FUNDS IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNTS NEEDED TO MEET CURRENT EXPENSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 218.415(17), FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Belmond Reserve Community Development District (the "**District**") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the District (the "**Board**") previously adopted Resolution 2020-19 to establish a written investment policy in accordance with Section 218.415, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to rescind Resolution 2020-19 and any other prior investment policies, to not adopt a written investment policy, and instead use the statutory default investment policies for the investment of public funds in excess of amounts needed to meet current expenses, in accordance with Section 218.415 (17), Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD:

- 1. <u>Rescindment of Prior Investment Policies</u>. The Board hereby rescinds Resolution 2020-19 and any other prior investment policies in their entirety.
- 2. <u>Use of Statutory Default Investment Policies</u>. The Board hereby elects to use the statutory default alternative investment policies for the investment of public funds in excess of the amounts needed to meet current expenses, in accordance with Section 218.415(17), Florida Statutes, as amended.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Belmond Reserve Community Development District (the "District") has determined to construct and/or acquire certain public improvements (the "Project") set forth in the plans and specifications as described in the Report of the District Engineer dated December 20, 2019, which is available for review at the offices of Meritus Districts, located at 2005 Pan Am Circle, Suite 300, Tampa, Florida 33607 (the "District Office"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Belmond Reserve Community Development District (the "District") has determined to construct and/or acquire certain public improvements (the "Project") set forth in the plans and specifications as described in the Report of the District Engineer dated December 20, 2019, which is available for review at the offices of Meritus Districts, located at 2005 Pan Am Circle, Suite 300, Tampa, Florida 33607 (the "District Office"); and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interest of the District to pay the cost of the Project by Imposing, levying, and collecting special assessments pursuant to Chapters 170 and 190, Florida Statutes (the "Assessments"); and

WHEREAS, the District is empowered by Chapter 190, Uniform Community Development Act, and Chapter 170, Supplemental Alternative Method of Making Local and Municipal Improvements, of Florida Statutes, to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate, and maintain the Project and to impose, levy, and collect the Assessments; and

WHEREAS, the District hereby determines that benefits will accrue to the property improved, the amount of those benefits, and that the Assessments will be made in proportion to the benefits received as set forth in the District's Master Assessment Methodology Report dated December 20, 2019 (the "Assessment Report") incorporated by reference as part of this Resolution and on file at the District Office; and

WHEREAS, the District hereby determines that the Assessments to be levied will not exceed the benefits to the property improved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE BELMOND RESE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT THAT:

- The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated as the findings of fact of the Board.
- Assessments shall be levied to defray a portion of the cost of the Project.
- The nature of the Project generally consists of master improvements The nature of the project generally consists of master improvements consisting of roads, water management and control, water supply, sewer and wastewater management, electrical power, landscaping, hardscaping and irrigation, all as described more particularly in the plans and specifications on file at the District Office, which are by specific reference incorporated herein and made part hereof.
- The general locations of the Project are as shown on the plans and specifications referred to above.
- As stated in the Engineer's Report, the estimated cost of the Project is approximately \$15,040,000 (hereinafter referred to as the "Estimated Cost").
- As stated in the Assessment Report, the Assessments will defray approximately \$19.375,000 of the expenses, which includes the Estimated Cost, plus financing related costs, capitalized interest, a debt service reserve and contingency, all which shall be financed by the District's proposed bonds, in one or more series.
- snair be innanced by the Districts proposed bonds, in one or more series. The manner in which the Assessments shall be made is based upon an allocation of the benefits among the parcels or real property benefited by the Project as set forth in the Assessment Report. As provided in further detail in the Assessment Report, the Assessments will be levised initially on a per acre basis since the Project increases the value of all the lands within the District. On and after the date benefited lands within the District are specifically platted, the Assessments as to platted forts will be levial in accordance with the Assessment Report. Until such time that all benefited lands within the District are specifically platted, the manner by which the Assessments will be limposed on unplatted lands shall be on a per acre basis in accordance with the Assessment Report.
- In the event the actual cost of the Project exceeds the Estimated Cost, such excess shall also be paid by the District from its general revenues if available or additional assessments or contributions from other entities.
- The Assessments shall be levied in accordance with the Assessment Report referenced above on all lots and lands, within the District, which are adjoining and contiguous or bounding and abutting upon the Project or specially benefited thereby and further designated by the assessment plat hereinafter provided for.
- There is on file at the District Office an assessment plat showing the expansion area to be assessed, with the plans and specifications describing the Project and the Estimated Cost, all of which shall be open to inspection by the public.
- The Chairman of the Board has caused the District Manager to prepare a preliminary assessment roll, a copy of which is attached in the Assessment Report, which shows the lots and lands assessment, the amount of benefit to and the assessment against each lot or parcel of land and the number of annual installments into which the assessment is divided. The preliminary assessment roll is part of the Assessment Report which is on file at the District Manager's office.
